Good Behavior Celebration

Classroom Conduct Grades

The "Turn-A-Card" system is used for classroom behavior management. This strategy helps each child monitor their behavior and encourages them to do their best. Students are given a weekly conduct grade based on how many cards turns they have had. It is expected that each student will stay on green (no card turns) throughout the day, but if a student does have to "Turn-A-Card", they will have a 10 point deduction from the 100 points possible for the week. Every time a card is turned an additional 10 points will be deducted. Weekly conduct grades are averaged together for the quarter.

Quarterly Celebration Criteria

At the end of each quarter, there will be a school-wide good behavior celebration. Students who have earned an "A" (93% and above) in classroom conduct for the quarter will be able to participate in the celebration. Students must also have no detentions or suspensions.

Weekly Respect Tickets

Teachers and staff members will hand out Respect Tickets to students who are *exceeding* the guidelines. On Friday mornings, we will have a drawing for students who earned a Respect Ticket throughout the week. One ticket from each homeroom class will be drawn, and the selected students will get to choose a prize.

Each student has their own Superpowers, and it is our mission to motivate them to excel, and celebrate their successes. At Franklin Elementary School, students don't just receive an education—they use their powers to create it!

Recognition Posters

Throughout the school year, students will be recognized for achieving excellence. "My Superpower is..." posters will be hung in the hallway to celebrate student achievements. Students who meet the established criteria will get to write their name on the poster. This is a quarterly recognition program.

Recognition Areas and Criteria

Attendance... Missed 1 day or less

Good Behavior... "A" in conduct

Academics... 3.5 or higher (Honor Roll)

Math... "A" in math on the report card

Reading... Made your AR goal (points and comprehension)

Spelling... "A" in spelling on the report card

PE... Good participation, wears tennis shoes to every class, and good sportsmanship/behavior

Music... Rhythm and singing skill tests (grade of at least 9/10)

Art... Determined by the amount of time each student is on task, follows directions, and exhibits positive behavior

Computers... Typing a certain number of words per minute based on grade level (add 5 WPM per grade level)
